Ben's passion for off-road motorcycling dates from the '90s, following father Richard at enduros around the UK.

Riding multiple MX series in the south in 2009, he achieved sixth overall in the Junior Open class, also competing in Witley Boxing Day enduros, Fast Eddy sprints, Muntjac and Corinium enduros.

In 2021 Ben started riding regularly in the SEEC series, achieving third in both Timecard and Hare & Hounds in 2023 (Clubman A), before moving to Expert.

In his first ISDE last year in Spain, heartbreak struck on Day 3 as a wrist injury forced retirement. Ben is looking forward to seeing the chequered flag in Italy this year with his father and brother.

Dan Aldred

Dan, now aged 38, started his riding career 20 years ago. He competed in local motocross for around five years

before moving to Enduro, riding the BSEC and BEC at Expert level. He has also been competing in the SEEC at Championship level for the past eleven years.

Keen to follow in his father Richard's footsteps to compete in the ISDE, Dan rode in Sardinia in 2013, achieving a Silver Medal with Witley MCC.

Last year he rode in Spain, securing another Silver Medal, and is searching for more ISDE glory in a club team with his father Richard and brother Ben.

Richard Aldred

Richard is a founder member of the Witley MCC ISDE effort, having first competed back in 1997 (Italy), Witley MCC's inaugural year. He went on to compete in 1999 (Portugal) and was a member of our team which won Best British Club Team that year. After a couple of years off, he came back in 2001 (France), 2003 (Brazil) and 2006 (New Zealand).

Now a seasoned veteran, he is looking forward to competing this year in the place where it all started, with his two boys Dan and Ben.

Guy has been riding motorbikes for over forty years, competing at national and international trials and enduro events. Enduro was a natural progression from trials and over the past 15 years, he has competed locally at the SEEC events as well as four Scottish Six Day Trials, four Scott Trials, two Romaniacs, two Erzbergs, the Weston Beach Race, Lagares Portugal, and the Dawn to Dusk 24hr. His training is as much bike time as possible, along with mountain biking and plenty of tyre and mousse changing practice!

In 2022 he fulfilled a dream to ride an ISDE in France representing Witley MCC and is now looking forward to Italy with the confidence of knowing what he needs to prepare for.

Elliot Davies

Aged 9, Elliot had his first dirtbike and was fortunate to learn to ride on well-known enduro sites with experienced older riders. He immediately started in youth enduro in the south of England and showed an affinity with the sport, and as soon as he was old enough, moved to the South Eastern Combine with the adults.

Winning the Clubman championship in 2012, he moved straight to the top level and won the overall Timecard and Hare & Hounds Championships in 2018.

He has competed at numerous national BEC rounds in the expert group and also in stand-alone extreme events. Internationally, he has competed at the ISDE in Portugal 2019 and in France 2021, successfully finishing both events with a Silver medal. He can't wait to be involved in the toughest enduro event in the calendar again.

Tristan Robinson

Tristan started riding motorcycles aged 4, first in trials before moving to enduros aged 16. Locally in the SEEC, he rides in the Expert class and has won third place in both the Hare & Hounds and Timecard Championships.

At an international level, he has competed in the Klaustur 24hr Transatlantic Challenge in Iceland, Le Touquet Beach Race, and various French Classic rounds, including the Trefle Lozerien. Tristan has also finished the Pre65 Scottish Trial twice aboard his rare 1964 Butler Tempest.

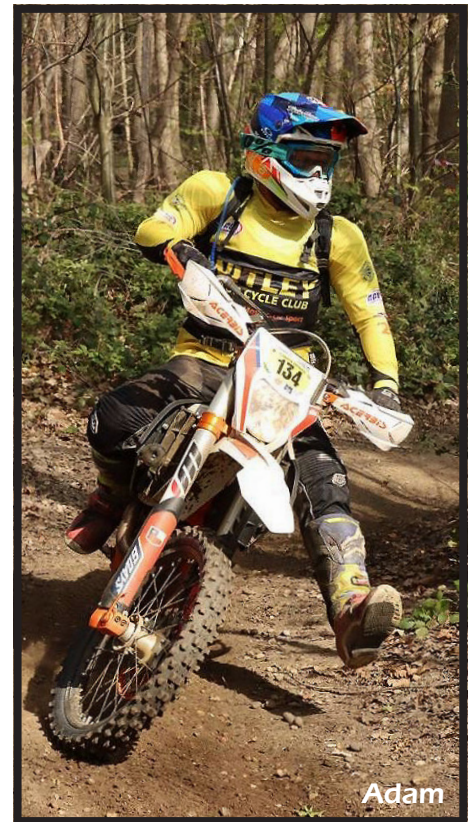

He has competed in British Enduro and Sprint Championship rounds, and won the Clubman 250-F title in 2019. He is looking forward once more to the ultimate ISDE challenge.

Josh Kirby

Josh started riding Enduros when he was 11, following in the footsteps of Dad, Mark. In 2018, he became British Clubman E1 Champion, followed by British Clubman E2 Champion in 2019. Locally, he has been the SEEC Timecard runner-up in the Championship class in

2019 and 2024, while also achieving runner-up in the Romaniacs Bronze Class in 2024.

Josh previously competed in the Witley ISDE Team in 2022 (France), securing a Silver Medal, and hopes to repeat the achievement or go one better this year.

Adam Pearson

Adam's journey into the enduro world came later than most, having never ridden a motorcycle until he was 26. In his first year racing Clubman B in 2013, Adam secured runner-up in the SEEC Time Card standings.

He tackled the gruelling 12-hour solo "Dawn Till Dusk" event in 2013, and 24-hour solos in 2014 and 2021.

He had a two-year stint in Australia and earned a top 10 finish in the Transmoto 6-hour Ironman class at Connondale in Queensland in both 2016 and 2017.

Returning to the UK in 2018, he raced in SEEC and other local events purely for fun, while also helping Witley MCC with their events.

Now, gearing up for his first ISDE, Adam is more driven than ever, with a passion to push his limits once again.

Neil started competing in trials aged eight, and went on to compete in the British Trials Championship, together with trials across mainland Europe and North America.

Following a move to enduro, Neil competed in multiple British Championships, achieving a second place finish in the Expert Open class, and was a driving force behind the first ever Witley Team to attempt the ISDE back in 1997.

This will be Neil's fifth Six Days and he is looking forward to the challenge once again.

Witley & District MCC at the ISDE

Witley members had been competing in "The Olympics of Motorcycling" for over 20 years before the first Club Team entry in 1997, with Richard Alldred, Neil Foster and Paul Jay representing their Club and country (and we are very

pleased to confirm that, 28 years on, both Richard and Neil will be taking part once again in 2025!)

Since then, Witley teams have appeared in 17 further International Six Days Enduros, with a good record of Medal success. Club members have travelled to the Czech Republic, Poland, Finland, Slovakia (twice), Germany, Spain (twice), Portugal and France (three times each), and as far afield as Brazil and New Zealand.

This year the event returns to Italy, where it really started for our Club effort, and where teams have already taken part twice previously.

We are pleased to support our talented riders and although there have often been two Witley teams, this year, for the first time, we will have three teams taking part, plus one further member making a solo effort– a total of 10 riders.
