

## Team Witley



### Dan Aldred

Dan, now aged 37, started his riding career 20 years ago. He competed in local motocross for around five years before moving to Enduro, riding the BSEC and BEC at Expert level. He has also been competing in the SEEC championship for the past ten years at Championship level.

Keen to follow in his father Richard Aldred's footsteps to ride the ISDE, Dan rode in Sardinia in 2013, achieving a Silver Medal with Witley MCC.

Eleven years later and keen for another crack at it, Dan will also be riding alongside his brother Ben, searching for more ISDE glory.



### Robert Carey

Robert is a veteran of eleven ISDE events since starting his ISDE career with Witley MCC in 2001. He has achieved three Silver Medals and a handful of Bronze Medals from Slovakia, Czech Republic, Portugal, Finland and Poland, to name a few.

Robert has also competed in the British Enduro Championships and French national championships for many years, including events such as the Trèfle Lozérien, Val du Lorraine and more.

Locally, he rides SEEC events, and can be found on a Maico from time to time!



### Neil Foster

Neil started competing in trials aged eight, and went on to compete in the British Trials Championship, together with trials across mainland Europe and North America.

Following a move to enduro, Neil competed in multiple British Championships, achieving a second place finish in the Expert Open class, and was a driving force behind the first ever Witley Team to attempt the ISDE back in 1997.

This will be Neil's fourth Six Days and he is looking forward to the challenge once again.

### Ben Aldred

Ben's passion for off-road motorcycling started back in the '90s, following his Dad at enduros around the country. Riding multiple MX series in the south, in 2009 he achieved sixth overall in the Junior Open class for the season. He also then competed in multiple Witley BXDE enduros, Fast Eddy sprints, Muntjac and Corinium enduros.

In 2021 Ben started riding regularly in the SEEC series, and after two full seasons achieved a third in the Time Card and a third in the Hare & Hounds series in 2023 (Clubman A class). Now, riding as an Expert, he feels ready to compete in his first ISDE, which has always been his dream.



### Brad Armstrong

Brad started riding schoolboy motocross at five years old, but swiftly moved to trials, aged seven, to follow his father. Developing a love of speed, a natural transition was made to enduro, aged fifteen, with an introduction to the SEEC.

Now 37, with multiple podium finishes at the Welsh 2 Day Enduro, and the 2015 SEEC Expert H&H Champion, Brad can still be found at regular SEEC events, as well as other local clubs. Recent years have taken him to France, competing in French Classic events, and now he is proud to be in Team SETRA with his father Paul, after having taken the club over in 2014.



### Paul Armstrong

Paul, 60 years young, was British Enduro Championship over-50s winner in 2017 and runner up for the next two years, ISDE France medallist, winner of SEEC over-50s Time Card and Hare & Hounds six times, and has ridden in the Welsh 2 Day 20 times, with several class wins.

Not to mention: European Enduro Championship participation several times, numerous French Classic Enduro participations, Scottish Six Days Trial participation four times, and a Husqvarna (HuskySport) and Michelin supported rider for many years. Paul is very proud to be part of the four generations of Armstrong family bike competition.
